2.7. Student Satisfaction Survey Report-

- Student Satisfaction survey was carried in prescribed format through Google platform. As per requirement, final year students were taken as respondents. A total of 134 out of 219(61.19%) responded to the survey.
- The responses were taken on 5 point scale for interpreting data and five classes were considered.

B	70-80	Very good
C	60-70	Good
D	50-60	Poor
E	<50	Very poor

- The average score on all questions was 84.60 % that indicates a very good response on teaching learning process
- The data with two highest scores of 90.15% and 88.96 % reveals completion of syllabus by the teachers in time and excellent communication of teachers with students respectively.
- The data with two lowest scores of 79.10% and 80.45% indicates that college must strengthen internships, field visits and mentoring process
- Suggestions made by the students-
 - a. More focus on development programs, communication and soft skills
 - b. More efforts to be taken by college for placements and internships
 - c. More time for practical, industry visits and fieldwork
