Feedback is collected online analysed and actions taken accordingly for better academic and support facilities.

I. Collection of feedback :

Feedback on teaching performance of every teacher is taken from the student at the end of every semester. The important parameters considered for the feedback are punctuality, command on language, subject knowledge, self confidence, use of teaching aids, lectures as per time table, completion of teaching as per teaching plan, intimation of internal assessment in time, providing learning outputs through case study, study tours etc, maintaining discipline in the class and encouraging students participation in class.

Feedback is taken using online platform with well defined, objective oriented questions on 5 point scale. By and large 70 to 80% of students actively take part in feedback process. One of the important aspects of the feedback system is that identity of student is not disclosed.

Analysis of the data reveals that 96.1 % of teachers graded between good to excellent whereas only 3 to 4 % of teachers show poor performance. The main reason attributed towards the poor performance is due to online mode of teaching where there is difficulty in delivering lectures and also difficulty in understanding by the students due to poor net connectivity.

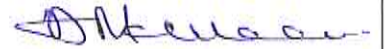

 • The data with two highest scores of 4.67 (99.33%) and 4.62 (92.38%) which indicate that, programme/syllabus of the subject increased the knowledge and perspective of teachers in their subject area and they also got freedom to adopt new techniques/ strategies of testing and assessing the students.
 • Two minimum scores were 4.05 (80.95%) and 4.19(83.81%) which indicates separate space for teachers in college canteen and ICT facilities may be enhanced.

- However, students need to improve upon their involvement in social activities.

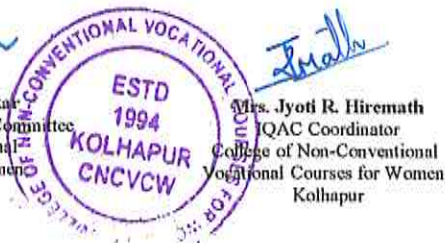
Suggestions made by the employers

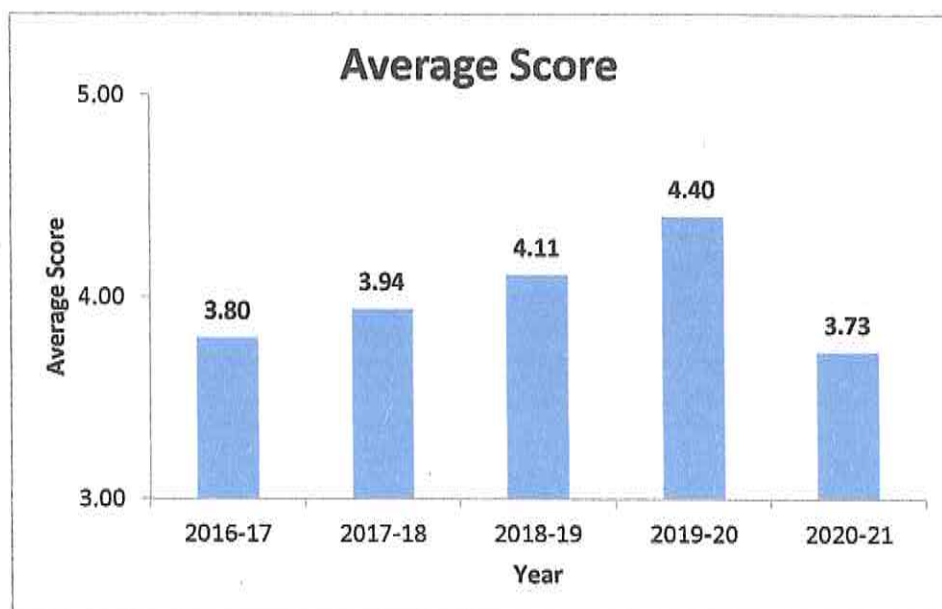

Review of Feedback taken from the students, teachers, alumni, employer and parents.

It also helps in knowing the overall outcome of the programme. The suggestions made from the employers, teachers, parents, alumni and students are useful for further improvement the curriculum and co-curriculum aspects. The consolidated report of the these feedback is enclosed as Annexure I.

Brief note on feedback:-

Students – Feedback from the students was taken at the end of both the terms. The rating of teachers was done in five point scale. Some of the significant observations were students emphasized on strengthening



personality development, communication and soft skills. They also suggested to strengthen placements and requested college to take more efforts for internship.

Teachers – Teachers feedback was also taken on five point scale. The two highest score of 4.67 & 4.62 which indicate that the syllabus of the subject increase the knowledge and perspective of the teachers in their subject areas. They also expressed their freedom to adopt new techniques and strategies of accessing the students. The minimum score indicated about the separate space for teachers in college canteen and ICT facilities of the college

Parents - The feedback of parents was taken through virtual parents meet. Some of the highlighting suggestions were to conduct offline classes in batches, provide e-content for quick reference of students, encourage students for physical activities.

Alumni – The feedback of Alumni was taken through virtual alumni meet. They suggested for more time for practical, industry visits and fieldworks. Also regular up-gradation of syllabus as per the market demand. Overall they suggested for the development of the college

Employers – The feedback of the employers was taken through Google Form. Very few responses were received and some of the feedback given were, more time for practical as students have good theoretical knowledge but are not much exposed to practical. They also emphasized on personality development and communication skills

2. Preparation of academic development plan with respect to teaching & up gradation of infrastructure

In the light of pandemic it was resolved to restrict co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. It was decided to tentatively:

- Publication of two research papers and presentation of two papers at conferences and seminars.
- Participation in webinars, FDPs, Short Term Courses, Orientations etc.
- Organising of Webinars, Quiz, National seminar, FDPs, Workshops etc.
- Development of E-Content.
- Submission of AQAR 2015-16 and AQAR 2018-19 to NAAC, Bengaluru.
- Setting up of Language Lab.
- Updating infrastructure including furniture and colouring of building.

3. Approval of document retention and disposal policy.

Retention of documents and disposal policy was prepared for office documents, departmental documents, library documents respectively (Annexure I). After the detailed discussion all the members of College Development Committee approved Document Retention and Disposable policy.

4. Approval of Academic Calendar for 2020-21.

Under the prevailing pandemic situation and in the absence of clear cut direction from the university it was resolved to prepare departmentwise teaching plan. It was further resolved to conduct the theory classes through online mode for a minimum period of three to four lectures per day for the first term only.

5. To review new academic programmes to be initiated from the college and additional teaching posts to be filled in.

It was resolved to submit M.Sc. (Food Science and Nutrition) to Shivaji University with an objective of implementation of same with effect from 2021 subject to approval from university and government authorities. Accordingly new posts can be

It was resolved to provide ICT facilities in each classroom, a language lab with 30 computers and sound recording studio for development of E-Content and for practicals of Multimedia students.

7. Preparation of Annual budget of 2020-21.

Resolution: The Revenue Budget and the Capital Budget presented by Mrs. Anuradha Bhosale, Accountant and also member of the committee was unanimously approved subject approval from the Management.

8. To take note of existing welfare activities and make suggestions for new activities for the students & employees.

Discussion:

It was resolved to take insurance for staff and students.

9. To take note and approve the annual report of 2018-2019.

It was resolved to approve the annual report of 2019-20 with appreciation of better academic performance.

10. To take note on Annual examination of April-May 2020..

In the light of prevailing pandemic situation and as per the directions of Shivaji University, Kolhapur it was tentatively decided to conduct online examination only for the final year students. As per the directions of Shivaji University no examination will be conducted for the first and second year of B.Sc. (FTM), B.A (DMFC), B.I.D., B.Com. (Bank Mgt.), B.Sc. (Envt. Sci.) and third year of B.A



(Multimedia) where students are promoted based on the previous semester performance.

11. To take note of recommendation of LIC from Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

It was resolved to initiate the process of approval of teaching posts, roaster system and selection of librarian post. It was unanimously resolved to get approval for principal post newly from Shivaji University, Kolhapur and initiate selection procedure as per the university guidelines.

12. Any other with permission of chair.

- Committee members were informed that due to lockdown/ prevailing pandemic situation the overall response to admission was comparatively less as compared to previous year.

Resolution There are some of the infrastructural development requirements of the college. They are as follows.

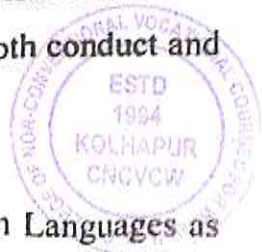
1. Purchase of new computers.
